A 10% non-refundable deposit is required upon signing the enrollment agreement. If your child qualifies for financial aid, the deposit will be set according to the financial aid award.

PAYMENT PLANS (only Plan A is available for international boarding students):

- Plan A: Full payment received (after payment of 10% deposit) on or before June 1, 2025
- **Plan B**: In two payments (after payment of 10% deposit): 60% payment received on or before June 1, 2025, 30% payment received on or before December 1, 2025
- Plan C: In ten payments (after payment of 10% deposit) commencing May 1, 2025, 100% by February 1, 2026

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OTHER EXPENSES TO CONSIDER

Activities Materials for special activities, hobbies, and other activities not included in the regular

curriculum.

Damages The School assumes all normal wear and tear, but students should understand that

they are responsible.

Private Music Lessons Private music lessons are billed in 4 installments over the course of the year (\$2,205

per year).

School Store Individual purchases including textbooks, personal supplies, and athletic items (apart

from uniforms and equipment supplied by the School). CT sales tax is charged on

taxable purchases.

Testing Charges for aptitude and achievement tests administered by the School, testing at

centers for SSAT and special testing required by preparatory schools or requested by

parents.

Transportation Transportation for medical visits, to and from airports, trains, and buses for vacations

and weekends.

TripsTickets, meals, transportation for special trips, entertainment, and secondary school

admission interviews. Additionally, the Ninth Grade will be charged for the annual June

academic trip.

Spending money While the School provides full meals and necessary services, there may be times when

students will wish to use discretionary funds for a variety of reasons (e.g., snacks,

haircuts, extra supplies).

1:1 Tutoring Optional instruction (supportive and remedial). Yearly expenses are as follows: one

appointment/week: \$2,825, two appointments/week: \$5,680,

three appointments/week: \$8,495, four appointments/week \$11,387. These are billed in

three installments over the course of the year.

Weekend ActivitiesCosts for boarding student programs and trips over weekends that are not entirely

covered by the School. Costs average from \$20-\$80 per month.

Accident Insurance For domestic students (optional). Covers \$1,000 of eligible expenses per incident for a

cost of \$100.

International Health Insurance Required for international students and purchased through the IMS Portal. Costs are as

follows: 10-month plan: \$2,595, 12-month plan: \$2,895
